Hospitality, Grace, & Diapers

“Why do you keep this kid around? I mean, all he does is create work for you.”

The young parents are looking at me as though I am idiot for asking such a stupid question. “Think about it. Your life before this baby was free and exciting. You went out together on weekends. You went to parties. You slept late, if you wanted to. But now?”

They are still staring with disbelief.

“What does this baby do for you? Does he have a job? Does he mow the yard? Does he help with the dishes? No, he cries and wants to be fed. He cries and wants his diaper changed. He cries and wants to be held. Why on earth do you keep him around?”

Usually, one of them feels it necessary to explain the obvious. “We keep him because he is ours. He is our baby. He comes from our love for each other. He’s our child.”

Such is the mystery of God’s grace. It is not because we are worthy or so important that God chooses to care about us. It is because we are God’s. We come from boundless depths of God’s grace.

That is what baptism is about. It is not something we do. It is a celebration of what God has already done in Jesus Christ 2000 years ago. It is a celebration of grace. That is why we baptize children. They belong to God. They reveal the heights, the depths, and the breadth of God’s love for the whole world. Jesus said, “Let the children come to me and do not stop them, because the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these.” (Luke 18:16)

What about the other children in our towns and neighborhoods? Don’t they belong to God, too? Haven’t they come from the boundless depths of God’s grace as well?

Radical hospitality is the grace we offer when we seek to adopt the children of our community as God’s children placed in our care. They are not ours. They are God’s. They are not to be exploited or ignored. They are to be cared for and loved so they can grow into all that God has hoped and dreamed for them. How is your church offering radical hospitality to the children of your neighborhood?

District Raises Money for Wings of the Morning

The Syracuse Charge (Asbury, Forest Run, and Minersville) raised \$13,400 to build a new church building, a parsonage, and purchase Bibles for the North Katanga UM Conference in the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

In response churches across the district are raising additional money to support the Wings of the Morning air ministry of Gaston and Jeane Ntambo, also in the North Katanga Conference. Gaston flies his own plane (and Jeane is flight control and weather advisor) to provide transportation for medical emergencies in many of the isolated villages of the Congo. His current plane is small and requires very expensive fuel. A newer plane could serve more people each trip and use cheaper, more available fuel.
