A DAY AWAY IN LENT

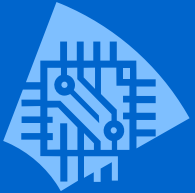

Because of the struggle many of our friends in poverty are having with food, (especially healthy and nutritional food) we are intending to increase and accelerate our garden projects. beginning in March and April.

This spring, we intend to enlarge our garden at Good Works on Luhrig Road and also begin a community garden on the lot we own at 100 Central Avenue. Hopefully, we will also launch a new initiative to plant small gardens at the homes of the seniors and widows we are building friendships with.

I am writing to ask if you might be able to help us with some of the following needs.

If not, could you pass these needs on to friends you know who might be able to help us?

- **Fencing that is 4 ft tall or higher (cattle fencing)**
- **Chicken wire**
- **Posts (6 ft tall). Preferably metal posts (called T-posts)**
- **Hoses**
- **Chicken feed**
- **Old egg cartoons (cardboard preferred)**
- **a rooster**

- **Pump to move water from a cistern to our fields**
- **Large plastic cistern (500- 1000 gallon)**
- **Shovels, hoes, garden sheers, rakes, hand gardening tools.**
- **Rear tine tiller (preferably 6 horsepower or higher)**
- **Top soil**
- **Old hay (any old hay)**

If you have items like these or other items you can offer us as we expand our faming projects, contact us.

HEAVEN AND EARTH SHALL KISS

February is designated as Black History Month. These 28 days are set apart to remind us of the journey and the contribution of African-Americans in this country. It is a month set aside for learning and re-learning the hard, painful lessons of American racism. It is a time set apart to celebrate those African-Americans who pioneered, persevered, preached and persuaded in our long, still evolving, march toward civil rights.

But, this Black History Month is different. February 2009 is different. It is the 200th anniversary of President Abraham Lincoln's birth, whose Emancipation Proclamation

pointed our country in the right and just direction. It is the 100th anniversary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), formed in response to white mobs burning the homes and businesses of black residents in Springfield, Illinois in 1908. And, it is the first month of Barack Obama's presidency – the first black American to be so elected. This Black History Month is different.

The psalmist, praying for the restoration of God's favor, writes:

Steadfast love and faithfulness will meet;
righteousness and peace will kiss each other.
Faithfulness will spring up from the ground,
and righteousness will look down from the sky.

Psalm 85:10-11

As a nation, we somehow understand that the election of Barack Obama transcends the affiliation of political parties and ideologies. It transcends the current economic crisis. For a nation, and for many across the world who still look to the United States as the singular beacon of democracy's ideals and promises, President Obama's election is an answer to the psalmist's prayer. It is the kiss of righteousness and peace. It is the meeting of love and faithfulness. It is the coming together of heaven and earth.

The Council of Bishops of The United Methodist Church was in session last November when our nation went to the polls. During worship the morning after Barack Obama's election, Bishop Jeremiah Park of the New York Area reflected on the significance of the election for persons like himself – a Korean-American who immigrated to this country seeking the fruits of democracy. He concluded his homily with this statement:

Rosa Parks sat so that Martin Luther King, Jr. could march.
Martin Luther King marched so that Barack Obama could run.
Barack Obama ran so that our children can fly.

O, Lord, may it be so. May we fly. May we continue to overcome. May heaven and earth kiss.
